Coronavirus Announcement

North County Women's Specialists is open. However, for the safety of our patients and staff, if you are experiencing symptoms on the day of your appointment, please call your doctor's office before leaving for your appointment.

Our number one priority is the health and safety of all the members of our community. Due to the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) outbreak, if you feel ill, stay home and contact our office to let us know and so that we may reschedule your appointment.

Please note: For the protection of patients and staff, we ask that only patients enter the office. Please no visitors or children at this time.

As we face these uncharted waters due to the Coronavirus, know that we are all in this together. The past few days have been a roller coaster and we are giving lots of thought on how to approach this pandemic as business owners and employers. Small business such as NCWS is the backbone of the economy and as the pandemic changes the global and local landscape, we are going to do everything in our power to keep our patients and staff safe and keep our doors open.

As part of our commitment to ensuring a safe environment for our patients, families, and staff, NCWS has updated its visitor policies in response to the current situation with COVID-19. As of Tuesday, March 17, 2020, NCWS is minimizing visitors to our office until the transmission of COVID-19 is no longer a threat. For this reason, we ask that only patients enter the office. Please no visitors or children at this time. Patients will be screened and if patient shows any symptoms of a respiratory infection (fever, runny nose, cough, shortness of breath) they will be asked to call the office to reschedule their appointment.

As a reminder: if you or your family have traveled recently to an area of risk, China, Iran, South Korea, Europe, Scandinavia, Japan, or Hong Kong, or if you think you may have been exposed to the virus by someone else who has visited one of these locations within the past two weeks AND you have symptoms of an infection (fever, cough, shortness of breath), you should call your primary doctor for further instructions. If you have severe respiratory distress, you should call 911 or go to the nearest Emergency Room.

Thank you for understanding and following these policies in order to do all we can to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

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
