As the number of cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) increases in the U.S. and globally, we're working hard to prevent the spread of the virus and to protect our patients and community.

Please refer to the information below for guidance; we will continue to update this page as new information becomes available.

- We are open and will be on an altered schedule. We will be limiting direct patient contact to emergent patients only. Our new schedule also allows for video consultations. Providing exceptional care in a comfortable, safe and sterile environment is still amongst our top priorities.
- If you are scheduled for an appointment and are exhibiting symptoms as outlined by the CDC such as fever, cough, or shortness of breath, diarrhea, and/or vomiting or if you have reason to believe you've come in contact with someone exhibiting symptoms or who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), we ask that you please reschedule for a later date, to protect the health of our staff and any patients who may be at-risk or immunocompromised. Call your Primary Care Physician or the nearest Emergency room.
- New, more stringent sanitation protocols have been implemented as part of our daily operations to reduce surface contamination. In addition, our staff is receiving ongoing reinforcement for preventative measures following CDC guidelines.
- We will be screening all visitors for coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, we understand this may be inconvenient, but is necessary for the safety of all patients and staff.
- Each patient is limited to be accompanied by one (1) guest. Please **do not** bring any children, especially those under 12 years old.
- We are encouraging everyone to wash their hands thoroughly and often, use hand sanitizer and follow best practices to protect the health and wellbeing of themselves, their families and our community at large.
