#### What is HIPAA and how does the Privacy Rule affect you?

When the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) was passed in August of 1996, this gave the federal government the ability to mandate how healthcare plans, providers, and clearinghouses store and send patient's personal information as it relates to healthcare. The Privacy Rule was created to protect your rights as a patient of our practice and we are required by law to be compliant with this regulation on April 14, 2003. Under the Privacy Rule you are guaranteed access to your medical records, allowed control over how your protected health information is used and disclosed, and allowed to take action if your privacy is compromised by following the practice's policy. Our practice is dedicated to maintaining the privacy of your personal information.

#### What is the Notice of Privacy Practice?

Our practice has an official Notice of Privacy Practice posted in our waiting room informing our patients about their rights surrounding the Protection of your IIHI, Individually Identifiable Health Information, and our obligations concerning the use and disclosure of your IIHI. This notice applies to all records created or retained by our practice. We can update our Notice of Privacy Practices at any time. It will be posted in our waiting room and you can ask for a copy of the current notice at any time.
