The U.S. National Center for Health Statistics defines a chronic condition as having one or more of three symptoms:

- The problem lasts at least 3 months in an uninterrupted fashion.
- The problem doesn't last 3 months but comes back over and over again for an extended period of time.
- The problem is a relatively low intensity problem that persists long term. This doesn't mean that it isn't a serious issue. It simply means that it is not an immediate life threatening condition.
