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MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

CONNECTED TO OUR COMMUNITY



Throughout this report, we share with you (anonymously) some of the heartfelt quotes and courageous stories that were sent to the Commissioners last fall.

Dear Friends,

For many years, we have utilized our Annual Report to the Community to explain how we provide services tailored to meet the needs of our local communities and why this is important. This year we also want to talk about how the community rose up in a very dramatic way and supported Women's Health when we were under fire.

Women's Health has always understood that, as a nonprofit organization, we have a duty to respond to unmet needs in our community within our area of expertise. In order to do this, we devote a substantial amount of staff time and effort to participate on various community committees, coalitions, and alliances. (See p. 13 for a listing.) We are proud that, as an organization, we keep our eyes and ears attuned to needs and opportunities.

One such need was back in 2006 when Boulder County Public Health identified the high teen birth rates in Longmont as an important issue impacting youth in that area. We marshaled our resources, co-located with Boulder County AIDS Project in Longmont's Powell Building, and opened up a Longmont Teen Clinic in July 2006.

However, in 2012, a community member from Longmont undertook a crusade to undermine critically important funding from Boulder County for our Teen Clinic in Longmont. He spoke at County Commissioners' hearings and wrote letters to the editor. He asked other community members to write to the Commissioners to demand they no longer fund us. In order to provide the Commissioners with a truer sense of the community, Women's Health called on our supporters to contact the Commissioners as well. The response was overwhelming! Within 48 hours the Commissioners received over 430 emails, letters, and phone calls in support of Women's Health. Our funding was not only continued but was increased.

Throughout this report, we share with you (anonymously) some of the heartfelt quotes and courageous stories that were sent to the Commissioners last fall. We hope they will provide a glimpse of what Women's Health means to many in our community.

2012 HIGHLIGHTS

SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF OUR CAPITAL CAMPAIGN FOR WOMEN'S HEALTH

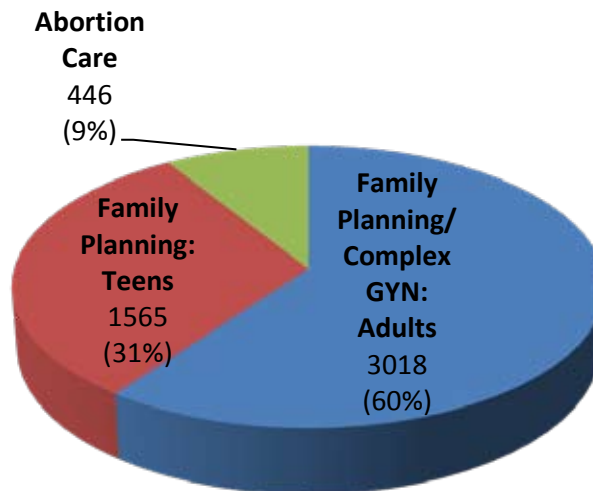
Women's Health kicked off its (first ever!) capital campaign in 2010 with an ambitious goal of raising \$1,150,000. The purpose of the Campaign was for facility improvements at both Longmont and Boulder sites and to retire all long-term debt. After one final push to our individual and corporate donors that qualified us for a matching grant from Gates Family Foundation, *we not only met but exceeded our goal!*

Renovations at both sites were completed throughout 2011 and 2012, resulting in greater energy efficiency, improved appearance and up-to-date technology access. These improvements were imperative to prepare for full participation in the changes that will occur in 2014 with the full integration of the Affordable Care Act.

CLINIC EFFICIENCY

During 2012, clinic hours of operation at both locations were modified to maximize utilization during times of high demand and to close during times of low utilization. As a result, significant savings were incurred without impacting patient numbers. In fact, while clinic hours were reduced by 10%, patient numbers as compared with 2011 *increased* by 4%.

SUBSIDIZED SERVICES

FAMILY PLANNING & GYNECOLOGY

Women's Health provides subsidized family planning and gynecology on a sliding scale which slides to \$0 for the lowest income patients. **In 2012, Women's Health served 4,583 patients in our subsidized family planning/gyn program, 76% of whom were below the Federal Poverty Line (FPL).** Only 4% of patients were above 250% of the FPL and paid full fee.

Sliding scale family planning/gyn services include annual exams/Paps; birth control, including long-term, emergency, and permanent contraception; testing and treatment for sexually-transmitted infections (STIs); pregnancy tests and all-options decision counseling; breast exams and referrals for free mammograms (*see right*), and menopausal care.

In addition, our Medical Director, a board-certified Ob/Gyn, provides specialized gynecological care for disorders or abnormalities. Complex gynecological treatments include colposcopy, Loop Electro-surgical Excision Procedure (LEEP), cryosurgery, and endometrial biopsies.

"For many women who do not have health insurance, or have poor health insurance coverage, BVWHC is the only place they receive any type of routine medical examination. BVWHC will see any patient, regardless of income or insurance status. Basically, they provide quality, compassionate care at an affordable price. It's crucial that we keep organizations like these in our community."

BREAST & CERVICAL CANCER SCREENINGS

Thanks to funding from the Women's Wellness Connection (WWC) and the Foxy Lady Fund, Women's Health is able to offer free breast and cervical cancer screenings, including mammograms, to low-income and uninsured women.

In 2012, Women's Health served 270 patients in our Breast Health program. Six patients were diagnosed with cancer and referred on for treatment.

WWC is a federally-funded state program that provides breast and cervical cancer screenings for low-income and uninsured women age 40-64. For patients not eligible for WWC (undocumented women or those under age 40), Women's Health utilizes funding from the Foxy Lady Fund and the Boulder Bust Fund (Boulder Community Hospital's auxiliary fund) to cover those mammograms.

"This organization is vital and necessary to the health of the women of Boulder County. I have actually received mammogram referrals, pap smears, and many other screenings from the organization since 1978 during various times in my life when I have found myself without healthcare. In 2005, Women's Health detected an abnormal pap smear and recommended a loop procedure which freed me from the cancer cells at the base of my cervix. The organization saved my life."

“Unplanned pregnancies and undesired pregnancies can be one of the most devastating factors in the life of a woman and those people in her family/community. A woman’s ability to prevent a pregnancy, plan for a child and/or choose whether or not to bear children is a basic human right and the foundation for a woman’s empowerment . . . Whether it is me or you, someone we will never meet or a dear friend, we are ALL impacted when it comes to reproductive health and access to services.”

LONG-TERM CONTRACEPTION

Long-term birth control methods, also called LARC (long-acting reversible contraceptives), prevent pregnancy for 3-10 years (depending on method), are more than 99% effective, and do not have to be thought about on a daily, weekly, or even monthly basis.

Long-term methods such as the Nexplanon® implant and the Mirena® and Paragard® IUDs have typically been cost-prohibitive for our patients. Women’s Health provides these methods at low or no cost to our patients.

Thanks to private funding, Women’s Health is also able to provide LARC to our abortion patients at the time of their procedure. **In 2012, 40% of abortion patients left the clinic with a long-term method of contraception in place.**

Women’s Health has also been at the forefront of educating teens to think long-term about their contraceptive needs. Women’s Health began offering LARC in our Teen Clinics in 2007 in accordance with guidelines of the American College of Ob-Gyns (ACOG). Recent studies have borne out the appropriateness and effectiveness of long-term methods for teens. **In 2012, 43% of Women’s Health patients under age 20 chose a long-term method.**

TRANSGENDER SERVICES

Women’s Health has always worked to create an accepting environment for all of our patients, regardless of gender identity or sexual orientation. In April 2012, after identifying a lack of available services for transgender individuals in Boulder County, Women’s Health added transgender services to our scope of practice.

Transgender services include:

- **Hormone therapy initiation and management.** Our physician supervises hormone therapy for adult sex reassignment following the Standards of Care set out by WPATH (World Professional Association for Transgender Health).
- **Referral information for sex reassignment surgery.**
- **General/preventive health care for trans men and trans women.**

“As a practicing clinical psychologist, I see frequent evidence in my practice that Women’s Health services are crucial to the welfare of many communities within Boulder County, including all social strata as well as transgendered citizens.”

NON-SUBSIDIZED SERVICES

ABORTION CARE

Women's Health provides warm, compassionate 1st trimester abortion care in the quiet and secluded environment of our Boulder clinic. Women's Health is certified by the National Abortion Federation and is a founding member of the Feminist Abortion Network, the remaining group of 13 nonprofit, independent, feminist-based abortion clinics in the U.S.



Women's Health offers patients a choice of medication abortion or an in-clinic procedure. **In 2012, 446 women received abortion services at Women's Health.** Of these, 17% chose medication abortion over the in-clinic procedure.

Because no government funding can be used to subsidize abortion services, Women's Health maintains a private fund to assist women who are unable to afford the full cost of the procedure. Our

Reproductive Equality Fund (REF) is funded entirely through donations from caring individuals in our community.

In 2012, Women's Health provided \$42,028 of financial assistance to 176 abortion patients (40%), thanks to funding from REF, the National Abortion Federation and the Freedom Fund, a project of the Unitarian Universalist Mountain Desert District.

Supporting Youth

"Being involved in BVWHC, their Sexual Health and AIDS Awareness Peer Education program as well as accessing their services throughout high school has completely changed my life. I not only became more confident but I found mentors and role models that have informed my decisions after school and till today."



YOUTH SERVICES

TEEN CLINIC

Confidential services for youth under age 20 during clinic time reserved exclusively for teens. **Out of 1565 Teen Clinic patients in 2012, 99% of returning patients avoided an unplanned pregnancy.**

HOME-BASED CONTRACEPTION

Collaboration with Boulder County's GENESIS Program to help prevent subsequent pregnancies in already-parenting teens. A Women's Health nurse provides contraception to mothers during home visits, eliminating barriers of transportation, child care, and cost. **Out of 52 clients in 2012, 100% avoided a repeat unplanned pregnancy.**

COMPREHENSIVE SEXUALITY EDUCATION

Medically-accurate, scientifically-based comprehensive sexuality education provided in local classrooms, as well as information and resources for teachers, parents, guardians and youth-serving agencies. **Our health educators provided 298 comprehensive sexuality education presentations to 6,421 students in the Boulder Valley and St. Vrain Valley School Districts (a 48% increase in SVVSD compared to 2011).** Also, for the third year, Women's Health collaborated

with the Longmont Youth Center and Boulder County AIDS Project to facilitate *Cuídate*, a six-session culturally-based curriculum to reduce sexual risk behavior among Latino/a youth ages 13-18.

SHAPE

High school youth in our Sexual Health & AIDS Awareness Peer Education program (SHAPE), receive training in sexual health and prevention and then educate their peers. **In 2012, 14 teen peer educators from Boulder, Longmont, Lafayette, Superior and Broomfield volunteered 2,455 hours (a 41% increase over the previous year) and reported 4,491 one-on-one interactions with their peers.** SHAPE is a collaboration of Women's Health and Boulder County AIDS Project, and is funded, in part, by the City of Boulder's Youth Opportunities Program.

YOUTH TECHNOLOGY INITIATIVE

Our Youth Services program uses popular technologies to reach youth with messages of sexual health and prevention. In 2012, **SHAPE's Facebook page had 657 fans**, and youth were able to ask anonymous sexual health questions and receive medically accurate answers through our **Text Line (1640 questions asked)** and **interactive Q&A feature of the TeenClinic.org website (1382 questions asked).**

"The Teen Clinic provides a safe and accessible place for young people to get accurate information and affordable health care. Parents are welcomed; there is a culture of communication and open mindedness in supporting teens to include their parents in their health care whenever possible."

Involved in our Community

"One could argue (and many scholars and researchers have documented) that much of a community's safety and well-being is connected to services available to women. Educating, caring for, and protecting women and their health and safety is critical for a community to thrive, and this is EXACTLY what BVWHC does."

"I volunteered at BVWHC all through college and I cannot tell you the profound impact that the clinic has on women of all ages across the state. . . Without Boulder Valley I would not be where I am today. They provided me the opportunity to work in a clinical setting, which has since translated into my passion for health policy, the completion of a Masters in Public Health, and a career advocating for health justice. Cutting funding would not only have a negative impact on the health of many women, but would be a lost opportunity for others, such as myself, whose career paths were catalyzed by our own experiences working at such a great facility."

VOLUNTEERS & OUTREACH

In addition to our volunteer Board of Directors and SHAPE peer educators (see p. 11), Women's Health offers a variety of volunteer positions for people interested in working in our clinic, filling focused volunteer positions, or providing support for one-time projects.

Through the National Family Planning and Reproductive Health Association, we advocate for federal family planning programs such as Title X. On a state level, we advocate for youth through membership in the Healthy Colorado Youth Alliance and are a leader in the Colorado Family Planning Initiative. We work with our partners in the Protect Families Protect Choice coalition on state legislative efforts, including hosting Pro-Choice Lobby Day each year.

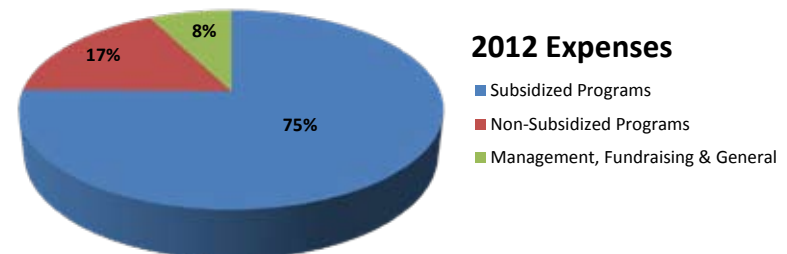
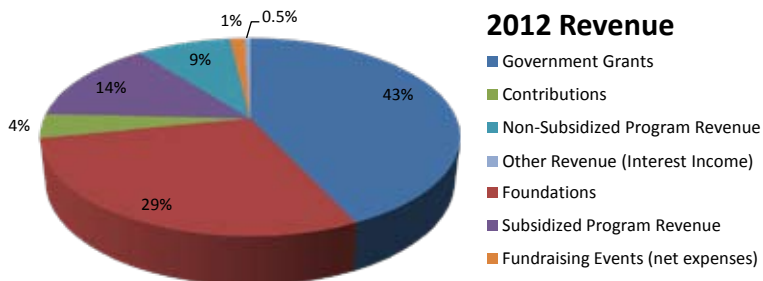
