

## TESTICULAR CANCER RISKS

**Testicular cancer diagnoses are on the rise in the United States. Some things to know about the risks associated with this cancer type:**

- The average age at time of diagnosis is 33.
- One main risk factor is an undescended testicle.
- Men with a father or brother diagnosed with testicular cancer are at an increased risk.
- White men are more than 4 times more likely to develop testicular cancer than Black or Asian-American men.
- Previously having cancer in one testicle increases a man's risk for developing it in the other
