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DEVELOPMENTAL MILESTONES: (18-36months)

18 MONTHS:

- Uses many gestures with words (pointing or taking by hand) to acquire needs.
- Uses and understands at least 10 words.
- Knows names of familiar people or body parts.
- Performs pretend play like feeding a doll or stuffed animal.
- Walks unassisted and may run.
- Throws or rolls a ball.
- Begins to feed self using fork or spoon.
- Makes marks on paper with pencil or crayon.

24 MONTHS:

- Speech understood by parents.
- Uses and understands at least 50 words.
- Uses two word sentences like "go mommy" or "up daddy".
- Enjoys playing with children of same age.
- Performs pretend play with more than one action, like feeding the doll then putting to bed.
- When asked, looks for familiar objects out of sight.
- Runs well and kicks ball
- Puts on or takes off clothes.
- Places simple shapes in a form board.
- Imitates a tower of 2-3 blocks.

36 MONTHS:

- Has a vocabulary of 100 to several hundred words.
- Uses three to four word sentences.
- Answers "what", "where" and "who" questions.
- Enjoys character play and playing with children of the same age.
- Uses thoughts and actions together that make sense like "sleepy, go take nap", or "baby hungry, feed bottle"
- Loves nursery rhymes, can hold up fingers to show age.
- Can tiptoe, keep balance and stand on one foot momentarily.
- Peddles a tricycle.
- Likes to climb obstacles or jump.
- Likes to dress and undress self.
- Can imitate drawings of a circle or cross.
