

After 14 kids, Nadya Suleman gets a medical procedure she says will make her more fertile

adva Suleman insists she doesn't want to get pregnant again. "I'm never having any more kids," the mother of 14 kids, including octuplets, said on May 7 when she claimed part of her uterus was being removed to treat benign cysts. "They're worried there could be precancerous cells. I'm terrified."

Four days later, she changed her story. "I'm not having half my uterus removed. That was an exaggeration on my part," Nadya admitted, adding that she was instead having a procedure called a myomectomy. "It actually enhances fertility rather than reduce it," she said. "If I really wanted to become pregnant, I could, but I would never." Though her rep says pregnancy is not her goal, Nadya's choice to get this particular procedure has raised suspicions that she may have more children one day.

OB-GYN Dr. Kevin Jovanovic, who does not treat Nadya, says it's possible. "The only reason to do a myomectomy is to retain fertility," he says. "If she's not planning on more children, there are better options."
