Over-The-Counter Medications Safe for Pregnancy

The following is a list of the over-the-counter- medications that you can take when you are pregnant. If you are experiencing any of these typical ailments, you can safely use these medications without calling the office. If you are experiencing anything more severe or have used these medications for at least 3 days without relief, call our office!!!

<u>SYMPTOMS</u> <u>MEDICATIONS</u>

Headaches Tylenol, Anacin 3, Acetaminophen

Do Not Take Aspirin or Ibuprofen

Cold/ Stuffy Head Sudafed, Mucinex D, Claritin D

If you have high blood pressure Coricidin

Stuffy Nose Benadryl, Actifed, Teldren, Claritin, Contac, Tylenol cold,

Runny Nose Neosynephrine pediatric, ocean nasal spray

Cough Robitussin DM, Cough drops or Hard candy

Sore throat Cepacol, Chloraseptic, warm salt water gargle

Constipation Stool softeners: Colace, Surfak, Doxidan, Metamucil

Laxatives: Milk of Magnesium, Pericolace (sparingly)

Diarrhea Kaopectate, Immodium (Call if persistent)

Nausea/Vomitting Emmetrol, Nestrex, Tums (Call if persistent)

Hemorrhoids Tucks Preparation H, Hot sitz bath, Anusol (Call if bleeding)

Painful Urination Call the office

If your symptoms persist or worsen, please call the office to speak with our nurse. This may be an indication that you need to come into the office or need a prescription for additional medications.

When you see another care provider or dentist:

- 1. Be sure they know you are pregnant.
- 2. No x-rays unless absolutely necessary.
- 3. Clear any medications not listed above or prescribed by another health care provider with our office.
