

In July of 2016, 50 year-old Birgit Dean noticed a lump on her left breast. For six months following this discovery, Birgit could not find an oncologist or a surgeon that she felt comfortable with, that is, until she met Dr. Premal Sanghavi, with Dignity Health — California Hospital's Los Angeles Center for Women's Health, who would prove to be the light at the end of the dark tunnel.

"She is brilliant, kind, compassionate, and unbelievably strong," states Birgit. "I was so blessed to have found her." Dr. Sanghavi confirmed the tumor was Stage 1 breast cancer and walked her through the treatment options, step by step, making sure to explain what was to be expected along the way. Luckily, Birgit's cancer was caught early and she was considered a candidate for intraoperative radiation, which meant that she would not need to endure the standard six weeks of radiation after the removal of the tumor and lymph nodes.

When it came time for Birgit to remove her bandages after her surgery, she was nervous and scared that the scarring would be significant. To Birgit's relief, the scars were hardly noticeable. In fact, there were only two, tiny scars, one made to remove the affected lymph node and the other for the tumor. The operation was successful and Birgit is thankful to have found excellent care at the L.A. Center for Women's Health. She is now considered cancer-free, but continues to see Dr. Sanghavi twice a year to make sure she stays in remission.
