AFTER CATARACT SURGERY INSTRUCTIONS

Your drops are for the operated eye only, spaced at least 5 minutes apart.

Besivance one drop twice daily for 7 days Vigamox/Polytrim one drop 3 x daily for 7 days

Prolensa one drop daily until finished (for 1 month if diabetic)
Nevanac one drop 3 x daily until finished (for 1 month if diabetic)

Durezol one drop twice daily for 2 weeks

one drop once daily for 2 weeks

Prednisolone one drop 4 times daily for 2 weeks

one drop 3 times a day for 1 week one drop 2 times a day for 1 week

once a day for 1 week

What to expect: After cataract surgery it is normal for the operated eye to have any of the following symptoms:

- ➤ Mild blurring and fluctuation in vision
- ➤ Mild aching, itching or scratchiness
- ➤ Mild tearing or crusting of the eyelashes—you may gently wipe the edge of the eyelids with a clean washcloth but DO NOT PUSH ON THE EYE

If you notice any of the following symptoms, please call our office:

- > Severe pain
- ➤ Thick drainage from the eye
- ➤ Marked increase in redness
- A large drop in vision.

General Instructions: Do not rub or bump the eye. You may resume your normal activities as you feel able. Swimming is not allowed for the first week after surgery. This includes hot tubs, swimming pools, lakes, etc. You may take a shower or get your hair done. Women should not use mascara or eyeliner for one week. You may wear your glasses from before surgery if you desire. A new prescription is usually given about 2 weeks after surgery.
